Aruba is a country in [South America](#). It shares borders with 3 countries: [Venezuela](#), [Curaçao](#), and [Bonaire](#). The people of Aruba are called Arubans. The country is situated in the Caribbean, an island in the Caribbean Sea, north of Venezuela.

The country has the time zone UTC-4:00 (AST) followed by dd/mm/yyyy as the standard date format.

Aruba is divided into 8 Regions. The capital of the country is Oranjestad, which is also the largest city in Aruba.

The literacy rate in Aruba is 96.8%.

The country's total area is 180 km² (69 sq mi), and the total population is 106,766. The country's average elevation is 217 ft, whereas the country's terrain can be defined as; Flat with a few hills; scant vegetation. The country's usual climate is tropical marine; with little seasonal temperature variation.

The area of land next to a sea is called the coast, and a coastline is defined as the line where land and sea meet. Aruba has 68.5 km of coastline.

The Aruban florin serves as the national unit of currency, and the Central Bank of Aruba is recognized as the country's central bank. The domain for Aruba is .aw and the country code is +297. is the country's coat of arms.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization, art, and architecture. The National Archaeological Museum Aruba serves the same purpose and is considered one of the most significant tourist attractions. The National Archaeological Museum Aruba is home to a large collection of artifacts. It has been designated as the national museum of the country.

The national dress of Aruba is the Madras, and 1 January is designated as National Day. In Aruba, the majority of the population practices Roman Catholicism as their religion.

Nature is a blessing from God and we must protect it because it provides us with the oxygen and food to survive. It also helps to keep our environment beautiful and clean. To emphasize the significance of nature, Aruba has selected a few forces of nature as national symbols. Aruba's national bird is the Prikichi, while its national animal is the Burrowing Owl. Sports have always played an important role in developing the social and cultural structure of Aruba and other countries. When it comes to designating a sport as the official symbol, Football is considered the country's national sport.

Betico Croes is the founder of Aruba. The country's national anthem was written by Juan Chabaya 'Padu' Lampe, and composed by Rufo Inocencio Wever. The country's national hero is Boy Ecury.

The tourism slogan of the country is "One Happy Island".

Evelyn Wever-Croes is the current Prime minister of Aruba, and Willem-Alexander (Monarch) is the President.

Aruba has declared Dutch, Papiamentu as the country's official language.
