
AUSTRIA

Austria is a country in <u>Europe</u>. The official name of Austria is the Republic of Austria. It shares borders with 7 countries: <u>the Czech Republic</u>, <u>Slovakia</u>, <u>Hungary</u>, <u>Slovenia</u>, <u>Switzerland</u>, <u>Liechtenstein</u>, and <u>Germany</u>. The people of Austria are called Austrians. The country is situated in Central Europe, north of Italy and Slovenia.

The country's total area is 83,879 km² (32,386 sq mi), and the total population is 9,006,398. The country's average elevation is 910 m (2,986 ft), whereas the country's terrain can be defined as; In the west and south mostly mountains (Alps); along the eastern and northern margins mostly flat or gently sloping. The country's usual climate is temperate; continental, and cloudy; cold winters with frequent rain and some snow in lowlands and snow in mountains; moderate summers with occasional showers.

The Euro serves as the national unit of currency, and Oesterreichische National Bank is recognized as the country's central bank. The domain for Austria is .at and the country code is +43. Golden eagle, Alpine gentian, Edelweiss is the country's coat of arms.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization, art, and architecture. The Natural History Museum serves the same purpose and is considered one of the most significant tourist attractions. The Natural History Museum is home to a large collection of artifacts. It has been designated as the national museum of the country.

The national dress of Austria is the Dirndls, and 26 October is designated as National Day. In Austria, the majority of the population practices Christianity Catholicism, and Eastern Orthodoxy as their religion.

Nature is a blessing from God and we must protect it because it provides us with the oxygen and food to survive. It also helps to keep our environment beautiful and clean. To emphasize the significance of nature, Austria has selected a few forces of nature as national symbols. Austria's national bird is the Barn swallow, while its national animal is the Golden eagle. The national flower is Edelweiss, whereas Apple Malus is the country's national fruit. The national tree of Austria is the Beech tree, and the highest peak is Großglockner.
