Azerbaijan is a country in Asia. The official name of Azerbaijan is the Republic of Azerbaijan. It shares borders with 4 countries: Iran, Armenia, Georgia, and Russia. The people of Azerbaijan are called Azerbaijanis. The country is situated in Southwestern Asia, bordering the Caspian Sea, between Iran and Russia, with a small European portion north of the Caucasus range.

The country has the time zone UTC+4 (AZT) followed by dd/mm/yyyy as the standard date format.

Azerbaijan is divided into 59 districts and 11 cities. The capital of the country is Baku, which is also the largest city in Azerbaijan.

The literacy rate in Azerbaijan is 99.8%.

The country's total area is 86,600 km² (33,400 sq mi), and the total population is 10,139,177. The country's average elevation is 384 meters, whereas the country's terrain can be defined as; Large, flat Kur-Araz Ovaligi (Kura-Araks Lowland, much of it below sea level) with Great Caucasus Mountains to the north, Qarabag Yaylasi (Karabakh Upland) in the west; Baku lies on Abseron Yasaqligi (Apsheron Peninsula) that juts into the Caspian Sea. The country's usual climate is a dry, semiarid steppe.

The Azerbaijan Manat serves as the national unit of currency, and the Central Bank of Azerbaijan (CBA) is recognized as the country's central bank. The domain for Azerbaijan is .az and the country code is +994. Flames of fire are the country's coat of arms.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization, art, and architecture. The National Museum of History of Azerbaijan serves the same purpose and is considered one of the most significant tourist attractions. The National Museum of History of

Azerbaijan is home to a large collection of artifacts. It has been designated as the national museum of the country.

The national dress of Azerbaijan is the Azerbaijani milli geyimi, and 28 May is designated as National Day. In Azerbaijan, the majority of the population practices Islam & Christianity as their religion.

To emphasize the significance of nature, Azerbaijan has selected a few forces of nature as national symbols.
