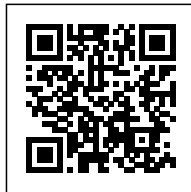


BONAIRE

Bonaire is a country in [North America](#). It shares borders with [Curaçao](#). The people of Bonaire are called Bonaire. The country is situated in the north of the Venezuelan coast and east of Curaçao.

The capital of the country is Kralendijk, which is also the largest city in Bonaire.

The literacy rate in Bonaire is 94%.

The country's total area is 288 km² (111 sq mi), and the total population is 20,104. The country's average elevation is 3 ft, whereas the country's terrain can be defined as; The island is primarily flat in the south, with hills in the north. The country's usual climate is a steppe climate.

The area of land next to a sea is called the coast, and a coastline is defined as the line where land and sea meet. Bonaire has 38 km of coastline.

The United States Dollar serves as the national unit of currency. The domain for Bonaire is .bq and the country code is +599-7. Blue Shield is the country's coat of arms.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization, art, and architecture. The Bonaire Museum of Natural History serves the same purpose and is considered one of the most significant tourist attractions. The Bonaire Museum of Natural History is home to a large collection of artifacts. It has been designated as the national museum of the country.

The national dress of Bonaire is the Kunuku (Women), and 26 February is designated as National Day. In Bonaire, the majority of the population practices Christianity as their religion.

Nature is a blessing from God and we must protect it because it provides us with the oxygen and

food to survive. It also helps to keep our environment beautiful and clean. To emphasize the significance of nature, Bonaire has selected a few forces of nature as national symbols. Bonaire's national bird is the Caribbean Flamingo, while its national animal is the Flamingo. The national flower is Kibrahacha. The national tree of Bonaire is the Kibrahacha tree, and the highest peak is Mount Brandaris.

Sports have always played an important role in developing the social and cultural structure of Bonaire and other countries. When it comes to designating a sport as the official symbol, Football is considered the country's national sport.

The country's national anthem was written by Hubert Obdulio "Lio" Booi, and composed by J. B. A. Palm.

Mausoleums are buildings dedicated to holding someone's remains. It serves as a reminder of the nation's revolutionary fighters who sacrificed their lives for the country. Mausoleums are one of the most significant historical landmarks. The national mausoleum of Bonaire is Bonaire Marine Park. The country's national hero is Don Martina.

The tourism slogan of the country is "Once a Visitor Always a Friend", and Edison Rijna (Governor) is the current Prime minister of Bonaire.

Bonaire has declared Dutch as the country's official language.
