The country's total area is 51,129 km² (19,741 sq mi), and the total population is 3,280,819. The country's average elevation is 500 m (1,640 ft), whereas the country's terrain can be defined as; Mountains and valleys. The country's climate is usually hot summers and cold winters; areas of high elevation have short, cool summers and long, severe winters; mild, rainy winters along the coast.

The area of land next to a sea is called the coast, and a coastline is defined as the line where land and sea meet. Bosnia and Herzegovina has 20 km of coastline.

The Bosnian Mark serves as the national unit of currency, and the Central Bank of Bosnia and Herzegovina is recognized as the country's central bank. The domain for Bosnia and Herzegovina is .ba and the country code is +387. Golden lily is the country's coat of arms.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization, art, and architecture. The National Museum of Bosnia and Herzegovina serves the same purpose

and is considered one of the most significant tourist attractions. The National Museum of Bosnia and Herzegovina is home to a large collection of artifacts. It has been designated as the national museum of the country.

The national dress of Bosnia and Herzegovina is the Bosnian Krajina, and 1 March is designated as National Day. In Bosnia and Herzegovina, the majority of the population practices Islam, Orthodoxy, and Catholicism as their religion.
