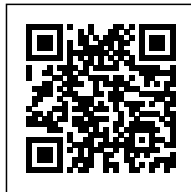
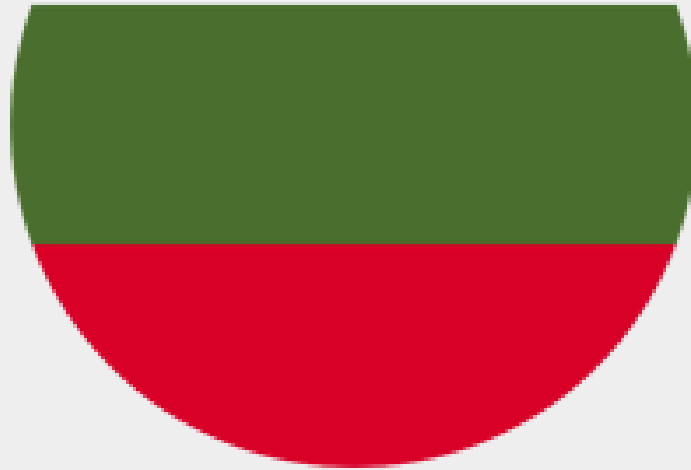


BULGARIA

Bulgaria is a country in [Europe](#). The official name of Bulgaria is the Republic of Bulgaria. It shares borders with 5 countries: [Greece](#), [North Macedonia](#), [Romania](#), [Serbia](#), and [Turkiye](#). The people of Bulgaria are called Bulgarians. The country is situated in Southeastern Europe, bordering the Black Sea, between Romania and Turkey.

Etymology discusses where a term is considered to have originated from and how its meaning has changed over time. Etymology has been a factor in the naming of countries all across the world, and Bulgaria has also been influenced. The etymology of Bulgaria can be defined as; The Bulgars, an extinct tribe of Turkic origin, created the country. Their name is possibly derived from the Proto-Turkic word bulġha ("to mix", "shake", "stir") and its derivative bulgak ("revolt", "disorder").

The country has the time zone UTC+2 (EET) followed by dd/mm/yyyy as the standard date format.

Bulgaria is divided into 28 provinces or regions. The capital of the country is Sofia, which is also the largest city in Bulgaria.

The literacy rate in Bulgaria is 98.4%.

The country's total area is 110,993.6 km² (42,854.9 sq mi), and the total population is 6,948,445. The country's average elevation is 470 m (1,542 ft), whereas the country's terrain can be defined as; Mostly mountains with lowlands in the north and southeast. The country's usual climate can be described as; Temperate; cold, damp winters; hot, dry summers.

The area of land next to a sea is called the coast, and a coastline is defined as the line where land and sea meet. Bulgaria has 354 km of coastline.

The Bulgarian Lev serves as the national unit of currency, and the Bulgarian National Bank is recognized as the country's central bank. The domain for Bulgaria is .bg and the country code is +359. Lion is the country's coat of arms.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization, art, and architecture. The National Historical Museum serves the same purpose and is considered one of the most significant tourist attractions. The National Historical Museum is home to a large

collection of artifacts. It has been designated as the national museum of the country.

The national dress of Bulgaria is the Garbs, and 22 September is designated as National Day. In Bulgaria, the majority of the population practices Christianity, and Bulgarian Orthodoxy as their religion.

Nature is a blessing from God and we must protect it because it provides us with the oxygen and food to survive. It also helps to keep our environment beautiful and clean. To emphasize the significance of nature, Bulgaria has selected a few forces of nature as national symbols. Bulgaria's national animal is the Lion. The national flower is Rose . The national tree of Bulgaria is the Granit Oak, and the highest peak is Musala.
