
CAYMAN ISLANDS

The Cayman Islands is a country in North America. It shares borders with 4

countries: <u>Cuba</u>, <u>Jamaica</u>, <u>Honduras</u>, and the <u>Bahamas</u>. The people of the Cayman Islands are called Caymanians. The country is situated in the Caribbean, three-island group (Grand Cayman, Cayman Brac, Little Cayman) in the Caribbean Sea, 240 km south of Cuba and 268 km northwest of Jamaica.

The literacy rate in the Cayman Islands is 98.9%.

The country's total area is 264 km² (102 sq mi), and the total population is 65,720. The country's average elevation is 18 m (60 ft), whereas the country's terrain can be defined as; Low-lying limestone base surrounded by coral reefs. The country's usual climate is tropical marine; warm, rainy summers (May to October) and cool, relatively dry winters (November to April).

The area of land next to a sea is called the coast, and a coastline is defined as the line where land and sea meet. The Cayman Islands has 160 km of coastline.

The Cayman Islands dollar serves as the national unit of currency, and the Cayman Islands Monetary Authority is recognized as the country's central bank. The domain for the Cayman Islands is .ky and the country code is +1-345.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization, art, and architecture. The Cayman Islands National Museum serves the same purpose and is considered one of the most significant tourist attractions. The Cayman Islands National Museum is home to a large collection of artifacts. It has been designated as the national museum of the country.

28 February is designated as National Day. In the Cayman Islands, the majority of the population practices Christianity as their religion.

Nature is a blessing from God and we must protect it because it provides us with the oxygen and food to survive. It also helps to keep our environment beautiful and clean. To emphasize the significance of nature, the Cayman Islands has selected a few forces of nature as national symbols.
