The national currency is the yuan, which has 10 jiao, and one jiao has 10 fens. All three units are known collectively as the Renminbi. The country code is +86 and the Domain is .cn.

The National Museum of China serves the same purpose and is considered one of the most significant tourist attractions. The National Museum of China is home to a large collection of artifacts. It has been designated as the national museum of the country.
