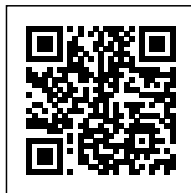
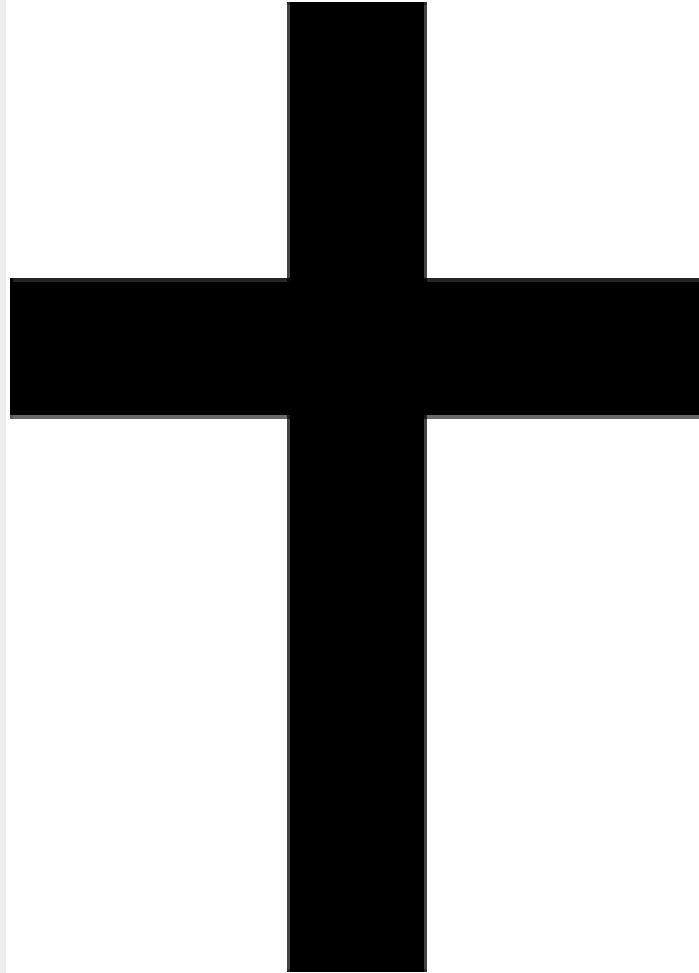


CHRISTIAN CROSS
