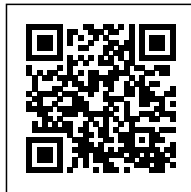


COSTA RICA

Costa Rica is a country in [North America](#). The official name of Costa Rica is the Republic of Costa Rica. It shares borders with 2 countries: [Nicaragua](#), and [Panama](#). The people of Costa Rica are called Costa Ricans. The country is situated in Central America between Nicaragua and Panama, bordering the Caribbean Sea and the North Pacific Ocean.

Etymology has been a factor in the naming of countries all across the world, and Costa Rica has also been influenced. The etymology of Costa Rica can be defined as; "Rich Coast" in Spanish.

The literacy rate in Costa Rica is 97.4%.

The country's total area is 51,100 km² (19,700 sq mi), and the total population is 5,094,118. The country's average elevation is 746 m (2,448 ft), whereas the country's terrain can be defined as; Coastal plains separated by rugged mountains including over 100 volcanic cones, of which several are major volcanoes. The country's usual climate is tropical and subtropical; dry season (December to April); rainy season (May to November); cooler in the highlands.

The area of land next to a sea is called the coast, and a coastline is defined as the line where land and sea meet. Costa Rica has 1,290 km of coastline.

The Costa Rican colón serves as the national unit of currency, and the Central Bank of Costa Rica is recognized as the country's central bank. The domain for Costa Rica is .cr and the country code is +506. Clay-colored robin known as Yiguirro is the country's coat of arms.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization, art, and architecture. The National Museum of Costa Rica serves the same purpose and is considered one of the most significant tourist attractions. The National Museum of Costa Rica is

home to a large collection of artifacts. It has been designated as the national museum of the country.

The national dress of Costa Rica is T-shirts with jeans for men and long skirts (golas) for women. 15 September is designated as National Day. In Costa Rica, the majority of the population practices Christianity as their religion.

Nature is a blessing from God and we must protect it because it provides us with the oxygen and food to survive. It also helps to keep our environment beautiful and clean. To emphasize the significance of nature, Costa Rica has selected a few forces of nature as national symbols. Costa Rica's national bird is the Clay-colored thrush, while its national animal is the Sloth. The national flower is Guaria Morada. The national tree of Costa Rica is the *Enterolobium cyclocarpum*, and the highest peak is Cerro Chirripó.

Mythical creatures can be found in the literature and mythologies of many different nations. They represent imaginative representations of various creatures, humans, or hybrids. They are known for their specific features, supernatural abilities, and distinctive appearance. The mythical creature of Costa Rica is Cadejo.

Mausoleums are one of the most significant historical landmarks. The national mausoleum of Costa Rica is The Guayabo National Monument. The country's national hero is Juan Santamaría.
