The country's usual climate is Mediterranean and continental; the continental climate is predominant with hot summers and cold winters; mild winters, and dry summers along the coast.

The area of land next to a sea is called the coast, and a coastline is defined as the line where land and sea meet. Croatia has 5,835 km of coastline.

The Euro serves as the national unit of currency, and Croatian National Bank is recognized as the country's central bank. The domain for Croatia is .hr and the country code is +385. Red-white checkerboard is the country's coat of arms.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization,

art, and architecture. The Croatian History Museum serves the same purpose and is considered one of the most significant tourist attractions. The Croatian History Museum is home to a large collection of artifacts. It has been designated as the national museum of the country.

The national dress of Croatia is the Hrvatska narodna nošnja, and 30 May is designated as National Day. In Croatia, the majority of the population practices Christianity Catholicism, Orthodoxy, Protestantism, and Islam as their religion.

To emphasize the significance of nature, Croatia has selected a few forces of nature as national symbols. Croatia's national bird is the Nightingale, while its national animal is the Meet Marten.
