Curaçao is a country in <u>North America</u>. The official name of Curaçao is the Country of Curaçao. It shares borders with 2 countries: <u>Aruba</u>, and <u>Venezuela</u>. The people of Curaçao are called Curaçaoans. The country is situated in Southern Caribbean and is located about 65 km north of Venezuela. Curacao is a group of islands of the Lesser Antilles.

The country's total area is 444 km² (171 sq mi), and the total population is 155,014. The country's terrain can be defined as; Slightly hilly with varying heights. The country's usual climate is tropical savannah climate.

The Netherlands Antillean guilder serves as the national unit of currency, and Central Bank of Curaçao and Sint Maarten is recognized as the country's central bank. The domain for Curaçao is .cw and the country code is +5999. The Crown is the country's coat of arms.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization, art, and architecture. The Curaçao Museum serves the same purpose and is considered one of the most significant tourist attractions. The Curaçao Museum is home to a large collection of artifacts. It has been designated as the national museum of the country.

The national dress of Curaçao is the Saya ku djèki, and 2 July is designated as National Day. In Curaçao, the majority of the population practices Roman Catholicism, Pentecostal, and

Protestantism as their religion.

The country's national hero is Tula. The tourism slogan of the country is "Curacao: Real. Different.".

Gilmar Pisas is the current Prime minister of Curaçao.

Curaçao has declared Papiamentu, Dutch, and English as the country's official languages.
