Djibouti is a country in <u>Africa</u>. The official name of Djibouti is the Republic of Djibouti. It shares borders with 3 countries: <u>Eritrea</u>, <u>Ethiopia</u>, and <u>Somalia</u>. The people of Djibouti are called Djiboutians. The country is situated in Eastern Africa, bordering the Gulf of Aden and the Red Sea, between Eritrea and Somalia.

Djibouti is divided into 6 regions. Djibouti is Djibouti's largest city, while Jībūtī serves as the capital.

The literacy rate in Djibouti is 52.8%.

The country's total area is 23,200 km² (9,000 sq mi), and the total population is 988,000. The country's average elevation is 14 m, whereas the country's terrain can be defined as; Coastal plain and plateau separated by central mountains. The country's usual climate is desert; torrid, and dry.

The area of land next to a sea is called the coast, and a coastline is defined as the line where land and sea meet. Djibouti has 314 km of coastline.

The Djiboutian franc serves as the national unit of currency, and the Central Bank of Djibouti is recognized as the country's central bank. The domain for Djibouti is .dj and the country code is +253. is the country's coat of arms.

The national dress of Djibouti is the Dirac, and 27 June is designated as National Day. In Djibouti, the majority of the population practices Islam, and Christianity as their religion.

Nature is a blessing from God and we must protect it because it provides us with the oxygen and food to survive. It also helps to keep our environment beautiful and clean. To emphasize the significance of nature, Djibouti has selected a few forces of nature as national symbols. Djibouti's national bird is the Djibouti francolin, while its national animal is the Elk. Djibouti is a member of the African Union (AU), Arab League, Organisation internationale de la Francophonie (OIF), and Organisation of Islamic Cooperation (OIC). The tourism slogan of the country is "Djibeauty" whereas, "Itixaad, Gudboonaan, Ammaan and Unité, Égalité, Paix - "Unity, Equality, Peace"" is the official motto of the country.

Abdoulkader Kamil Mohamed is the current Prime minister of Djibouti, and Ismaïl Omar Guelleh is the President.

Djibouti has declared Afar as the country's official language.
