Dominica is a country in North America. The official name of Dominica is the Commonwealth of Dominica. The people of Dominica are called Dominicans. The country is situated in the Caribbean, an island between the Caribbean Sea and the North Atlantic Ocean, about halfway between Puerto Rico and Trinidad and Tobago.

Dominica is known for Victoria Falls, beaches, and the Boiling Lake. The national dish of Dominica is Callaloo. Mamajuana, in addition to being a traditional beverage, is one of the country's national drinks. The national instrument of Dominica is the Accordion.

The country has the time zone UTC-4 (AST) followed by dd/mm/yyyy as the standard date format.

Dominica is divided into 10 parishes. The capital of the country is Roseau, which is also the largest city in Dominica.

The literacy rate in Dominica is 93.73%.

The country's total area is 750 km² (290 sq mi), and the total population is 71,986. The country's average elevation is 724 m (2,372 ft), whereas the country's terrain can be defined as; Rugged mountains of volcanic origin. The country's usual climate is tropical; moderated by northeast trade winds; heavy rainfall.

The area of land next to a sea is called the coast, and a coastline is defined as the line where land and sea meet. Dominica has 148 km of coastline.

The Eastern Caribbean dollar serves as the national unit of currency, and the Eastern Caribbean Central Bank is recognized as the country's central bank. The domain for Dominica is .dm and the country code is +767. Sisserou parrot is the country's coat of arms.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization, art, and architecture. The Dominica Museum serves the same purpose and is considered one of the most significant tourist attractions. The Dominica Museum is home to a large collection of artifacts. It

has been designated as the national museum of the country.

The national dress of Dominica is the Jip or Jupe, and 3 November is designated as National Day. In Dominica, the majority of the population practices Christianity, and Folk as their religion.

Nature is a blessing from God and we must protect it because it provides us with the oxygen and food to survive. It also helps to keep our environment beautiful and clean. To emphasize the significance of nature, Dominica has selected a few forces of nature as national symbols. The Sisserou parrot is both the national bird and animal of Dominica. The national flower is Sabinea Carinalis, whereas Carambola is the country's national fruit. The national tree of Dominica is the Bwa Kwaib, and the highest peak is Morne Diablotins.

Mythical creatures can be found in the literature and mythologies of many different nations. They represent imaginative representations of various creatures, humans, or hybrids. They are known for their specific features, supernatural abilities, and distinctive appearance. The mythical creature of Dominica is El Baka.

Sports have always played an important role in developing the social and cultural structure of Dominica and other countries. When it comes to designating a sport as the official symbol, Football is considered the country's national sport.

Prime Minister Patrick John is the founder of Dominica. The country's national anthem was written by Wilfred Oscar Morgan Pond, and composed by Lemuel McPherson Christian.

The country's national hero is Cecil Rawle.

Due to their unique qualities and rich cultural or historical backgrounds, national monuments around the world are of great importance. Catholic Cathedral is recognized as the national monument of the country. It attracts visitors from all around the world.

Numerous organizations are working on a global level to improve the current state of affairs and to collaborate in order to establish and maintain constructive partnerships. Dominica is a member of the <u>Caribbean Community (CARICOM or CC)</u>, <u>Commonwealth of Nations</u>, <u>Organisation internationale de la Francophonie (OIF)</u>, <u>Organization of American States (OAS)</u>, and <u>United Nations (UN)</u>. Dominica collaborates with them to organize, analyze, and address various events and situations.

The tourism slogan of the country is "The Nature Island" whereas, "Après Bondié, C'est la Ter-Patois- "After God, the Earth" is the official motto of the country.

Roosevelt Skerrit is the current Prime minister of Dominica, and Charles Savarin is the Charles Savarin.

Dominica has declared English as the country's official language.
