
## **DOMINICAN REPUBLIC**

The country's total area is 48,671 km<sup>2</sup> (18,792 sq mi), and the total population is 10,847,910. The country's average elevation is 1,391.08 ft, whereas the country's terrain can be defined as; Rugged highlands and mountains with fertile valleys interspersed. The country's usual climate is tropical maritime; with little seasonal temperature variation; seasonal variation in rainfall.

The area of land next to a sea is called the coast, and a coastline is defined as the line where land and sea meet. The Dominican Republic has 1,288 km of coastline.

The Dominican Peso serves as the national unit of currency, and the Central Bank of the Dominican Republic is recognized as the country's central bank. The domain for the Dominican Republic is .do and the country code is +1. Palmchat is the country's coat of arms.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization, art, and architecture. The National Museum of Natural History serves the same purpose and is
