El Salvador is a country in <u>North America</u>. The official name of El Salvador is the Republic of El Salvador. It shares borders with 2 countries: <u>Honduras</u>, and <u>Guatemala</u>. The country's usual climate is tropical; rainy season (May to October); dry season (November to April); tropical on the coast; temperate in the uplands.

The area of land next to a sea is called the coast, and a coastline is defined as the line where land and sea meet. El Salvador has 307 Km of coastline.

The United States Dollar serves as the national unit of currency, and the Central Reserve Bank of El Salvador is recognized as the country's central bank. The domain for El Salvador is .sv and the country code is +503. Turquoise-browed motmot is the country's coat of arms.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization, art, and architecture. Dr. David J. Guzmán National Museum serves the same purpose and is considered one of the most significant tourist attractions. Dr. David J. Guzmán National Museum is

home to a large collection of artifacts. It has been designated as the national museum of the country.

The national dress of El Salvador is men wearing cotton suits or shirts with jeans and a cowboy hat. 15 September is designated as National Day. In El Salvador, the majority of the population practices Christianity Roman Catholicism, and Protestantism as their religion.

Nature is a blessing from God and we must protect it because it provides us with the oxygen and food to survive. It also helps to keep our environment beautiful and clean. To emphasize the significance of nature, El Salvador has selected a few forces of nature as national symbols. El Salvador's national bird is the Turquoise-browed Motmot, while its national animal is the Motmot. The national flower is Izote. The national tree of El Salvador is the Maquilishuat, and the highest peak is Cerro El Pital.

Mythical creatures can be found in the literature and mythologies of many different nations. They represent imaginative representations of various creatures, humans, or hybrids. They are known for their specific features, supernatural abilities, and distinctive appearance. The mythical creature of El Salvador is Cuyancua.

Sports have always played an important role in developing the social and cultural structure of El Salvador and other countries. When it comes to designating a sport as the official symbol, Football is considered the country's national sport.
