
EQUATORIAL GUINEA

Equatorial Guinea is a country in <u>Africa</u>. The official name of Equatorial Guinea is the Republic of Equatorial Guinea. It shares borders with 2 countries: <u>Cameroon</u>, and <u>Gabon</u>. The people of Equatorial Guinea are called Equatorial Guineans. The country is in Central Africa, bordering the Bight of Biafra, between Cameroon and Gabon.

The country has the time zone UTC+1 (WAT) followed by dd/mm/yyyy as the standard date format.

Equatorial Guinea is divided into 8 provinces. Bata is Equatorial Guinea's largest city, while Malabo serves as the capital.

The literacy rate in Equatorial Guinea is 95.0%.

The country's total area is 28,050 km² (10,830 sq mi), and the total population is 1,402,985. The country's average elevation is 577 m (1,893 ft), whereas the country's terrain can be defined as; Coastal plains rising to interior hills; islands are volcanic. The country's usual climate is tropical; always hot, and humid.

The area of land next to a sea is called the coast, and a coastline is defined as the line where land and sea meet. Equatorial Guinea has 296 km of coastline.

The Central African CFA franc serves as the national unit of currency, and the Bank of Central African States is recognized as the country's central bank. The domain for Equatorial Guinea is .gq and the country code is +240.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization, art, and architecture. The Museum of Modern Art Equatorial Guinea serves the same purpose and is considered one of the most significant tourist attractions. The Museum of Modern Art Equatorial Guinea is home to a large collection of artifacts. It has been designated as the national museum of the country.

The national dress of Equatorial Guinea is for men to wear long loose gowns or robes over loose pants that are tapered at the mid-calf. 12 October is designated as National Day. In Equatorial

Guinea, the majority of the population practices Christianity Catholicism, Protestantism, and other Christianity faiths as their religion.

Nature is a blessing from God and we must protect it because it provides us with the oxygen and food to survive. It also helps to keep our environment beautiful and clean. To emphasize the significance of nature, Equatorial Guinea has selected a few forces of nature as national symbols. Equatorial Guinea's national animal is the Giraffe.
