French Polynesia is a country in <u>Australia/Oceania</u>. The people of French Polynesia are called French Polynesians. The country is situated in Oceania, with five archipelagoes (Archipel Des Tuamotu, Iles Gambier, Iles Marquises, Iles Tubuai, Society Islands) in the South Pacific Ocean about halfway between South America and Australia.

The etymology of French Polynesia can be defined as; Borrowed from French polynésie, coined by Charles de Brosses in 1756, from Ancient Greek $\pi o \lambda \dot{o} \zeta$ (polús, "many") + $\nu \ddot{\eta} \sigma o \zeta$ (nêsos, "island").

An ethnicity is a group or sub-group of people who are connected based on common characteristics which may include religion, origin, language, traditions, or culture. The ethnic groups in French Polynesia include unmixed Polynesians, Demis, Europeans, and East Asians.

Air Tahiti Nui is the national airline of French Polynesia. The national colors of the country are red and white. The emoji flag of the country is ????????, and the ISO code is PYF.

French Polynesia is known for its stunning beaches and resorts. The national dish of French Polynesia is Poisson cru. Tahiti Drink, in addition to being a traditional beverage, is one of the country's national drinks. The national instrument of French Polynesia is Kettledrums.

The country has the time zone UTC-10:00UTC-09:30 (Marquesas Islands) UTC-09:00 (Gambier Islands) followed by dd/mm/yyyy as the standard date format.

French Polynesia is divided into 5 administrative subdivisions. Fa'a'ā is French Polynesia's largest city, while Papeete serves as the capital.

The literacy rate in French Polynesia is 98%.

The country's total area is 4,167 km² (1,609 sq mi), and the total population is 280,904. The country's average elevation is 1,121 m (3,675 ft), whereas the country's terrain can be defined as; Mixture of rugged high islands and low islands with reefs. The country's usual climate is tropical, but moderate.

The area of land next to a sea is called the coast, and a coastline is defined as the line where land and sea meet. French Polynesia has 2,525 km of coastline.

The CFP franc serves as the national unit of currency. The domain for French Polynesia is .pf and the country code is +689.

9 March is designated as National Day. In French Polynesia, the majority of the population practices Maohi Protestantism as their religion.

Nature is a blessing from God and we must protect it because it provides us with the oxygen and food to survive. It also helps to keep our environment beautiful and clean. To emphasize the

significance of nature, French Polynesia has selected a few forces of nature as national symbols. French Polynesia's national bird is the Albatross, while its national animal is the Sea turtle.
