
IRAN

Iran is a country in <u>Asia</u>. The official name of Iran is the Islamic Republic of Iran. It shares borders with 7 countries: <u>Azerbaijan</u>, <u>Armenia</u>, <u>Turkmenistan</u>, <u>Pakistan</u>, <u>Afghanistan</u>, <u>Turkiye</u>, and <u>Iraq</u>. The people of Iran are called Iranians. The country is in the Middle East, bordering the Gulf of Oman, the Persian Gulf, and the Caspian Sea, between Iraq and Pakistan.

The country's total area is 1,648,195 km² (636,372 sq mi), and the total population is 83,992,949. The country's average elevation is 1,305 m (4,281 ft), whereas the country's terrain can be defined as; Rugged, mountainous rim; high, central basin with deserts, and mountains; small, discontinuous plains along both coasts. The country's usual climate can be described as; Mostly arid or semiarid, subtropical along the Caspian coast.

The area of land next to a sea is called the coast, and a coastline is defined as the line where land and sea meet. Iran has 2,440 km of coastline.

The Iranian rial serves as the national unit of currency, and the Central Bank of Iran (CBI) is recognized as the country's central bank. The domain for Iran is .ir and the country code is +98. The name of Allah is the country's coat of arms.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization,

art, and architecture. The National Museum of Iran serves the same purpose and is considered one of the most significant tourist attractions. The National Museum of Iran is home to a large collection of artifacts. It has been designated as the national museum of the country.

The national dress of Iran is the Shalvar, and Jameh combination, often with a wide belt called Kamarband, and 1 April is designated as National Day. In Iran, the majority of the population practices Islam, Christianity, and Zoroastrianism as their religion.
