Ireland is a country in <u>Europe</u>. The official name of Ireland is the Republic of Ireland. It shares borders with the <u>United Kingdom</u>. The people of Ireland are called Irish. The country is in Western Europe, occupying five-sixths of the island of Ireland in the North Atlantic Ocean, west of Great Britain.

The country's total area is 84,421 km² (32,595 sq mi), and the total population is 4,937,786. The country's average elevation is 118 m (387 ft), whereas the country's terrain can be defined as; Mostly level to rolling interior plain surrounded by rugged hills and low mountains; sea cliffs on the west coast. The country's usual climate is temperate maritime; modified by North Atlantic Current; with mild winters, and cool summers; consistently humid; overcast about half the time.

The area of land next to a sea is called the coast, and a coastline is defined as the line where land and sea meet. Ireland has 1,448 km of coastline.

The Euro serves as the national unit of currency, and the Central Bank of Ireland is recognized as the country's central bank. The domain for Ireland is .ie and the country code is +353. Harp and the Shamrock is the country's coat of arms.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization, art, and architecture. The National Museum of Ireland serves the same purpose and is considered one of the most significant tourist attractions. The National Museum of Ireland is home to a large

collection of artifacts. It has been designated as the national museum of the country.

The national dress of Ireland is the Kilt, and 13 March is designated as National Day. In Ireland, the majority of the population practices Roman Catholicism as their religion.

Nature is a blessing from God and we must protect it because it provides us with the oxygen and food to survive. It also helps to keep our environment beautiful and clean. To emphasize the significance of nature, Ireland has selected a few forces of nature as national symbols. Ireland's national bird is the Northern lapwing, while its national animal is the Irish Hare.
