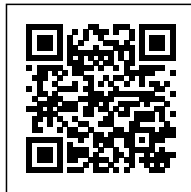


# ISLE OF MAN

The Isle of Man is a country in [Europe](#). It shares borders with the [United Kingdom](#). The people of the Isle of Man are called Manx. The country is situated in Western Europe, an island in the Irish Sea, between Great Britain and Ireland.

Etymology discusses where a term is considered to have originated from and how its meaning has changed over time. Etymology has been a factor in the naming of countries all across the world, and the Isle of Man has also been influenced. The etymology of the Isle of Man can be defined as; The island's name derives from Manannán, a Celtic sea god.

An ethnicity is a group or sub-group of people who are connected based on common characteristics which may include religion, origin, language, traditions, or culture. The ethnic group in the Isle of Man is Manx.

The national color of the country is red. The emoji flag of the country is ????????, and the ISO code is IMN.

The Isle of Man is known for its natural beauty, and rolling hills. The national dish of the Isle of Man is Spuds and Herrin.

The country has the time zone UTC±00:00 (GMT) followed by dd/mm/yyyy as the standard date format.

The Isle of Man is divided into 6 sheadings, 15 parishes, 9 towns, and villages. The capital of the country is Douglas, which is also the largest city on the Isle of Man.

The literacy rate in the Isle of Man is 99%.

The country's total area is 84,421 km<sup>2</sup> (32,595 sq mi), and the total population is 85,032. The country's average elevation is 378m (1240ft), whereas the country's terrain can be defined as; Hills in the north and south bisected by a central valley. The country's usual climate is temperate; with cool summers and mild winters; overcast about a third of the time.

The area of land next to a sea is called the coast, and a coastline is defined as the line where land and sea meet. The Isle of Man has 160 km of coastline.

The Pound sterling, the Manx pound serves as the national unit of currency. The domain for the Isle of Man is .im and the country code is +44. Manx triskelion is the country's coat of arms.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization, art, and architecture. The Manx Museum serves the same purpose and is considered one of the most significant tourist attractions. The Manx Museum is home to a large collection of artifacts. It has been designated as the national museum of the country.

The national dress of the Isle of Man is a blue coat, sailor jacket, and blue pants to complement the naval look. Their weekday footwear is made of skin. 13 March is designated as National Day. In the

Isle of Man, the majority of the population practices Christianity as their religion.

Nature is a blessing from God and we must protect it because it provides us with the oxygen and food to survive. It also helps to keep our environment beautiful and clean. To emphasize the significance of nature, the Isle of Man has selected a few forces of nature as national symbols. The Isle of Man's national animal is the Manx cat. The national flower is Ragwort, and the highest peak is Snaefell.

Sports have always played an important role in developing the social and cultural structure of the Isle of Man and other countries. When it comes to designating a sport as the official symbol, Cricket is considered the country's national sport.

Poetry is a highly valued form of art, and many poets are considered significant national symbols of the country. The national poet of the Isle of Man is Thomas Edward Brown.

The country's national anthem was written by William Henry Gill (English), and John J. Kneen (Manx).

The country's national hero is Fionn mac Cumhaill. "Quocunque Jeceris Stabit -"whithersoever you throw it, it will stand" is the official motto of the country.

Sir Richard Gozney (Lieutenant governor) is the current Prime minister of the Isle of Man, and Elizabeth II (Monarch) is the President.

The Isle of Man has declared English and Manx as the country's official languages.
