
## **LITHUANIA**

Lithuania is a country in <u>Europe</u>. The official name of Lithuania is the Republic of Lithuania. It shares borders with 3 countries: <u>Latvia</u>, <u>Belarus</u>, and <u>Poland</u>. The country has the time zone UTC+2 (EET) followed by yyy/mm/dd as the standard date format.

Lithuania is divided into 10 counties and 60 municipalities. The capital of the country is Vilnius, which is also the largest city in Lithuania.

The literacy rate in Lithuania is 99.8%.

The country's total area is 65,300 km<sup>2</sup> (25,200 sq mi), and the total population is 2,722,289. The country's average elevation is 110 m (361 ft), whereas the country's terrain can be defined as; Lowland, with many scattered small lakes, and fertile soil. The country's usual climate is transitional, between maritime and continental; wet, moderate winters and summers.

The area of land next to a sea is called the coast, and a coastline is defined as the line where land and sea meet. Lithuania has 90 km of coastline.

The Lithuanian Litas serves as the national unit of currency, and The Bank of Lithuania is recognized as the country's central bank. The domain for Lithuania is .lt and the country code is +370. The mounted knight known as Vytis (the Chaser) is the country's coat of arms.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization, art, and architecture. The National Museum of Lithuania serves the same purpose and is considered one of the most significant tourist attractions. The National Museum of Lithuania is home to a large collection of artifacts. It has been designated as the national museum of the country.

The national dress of Lithuania is the Mazoji Lietuva, and 16 February is designated as National Day. In Lithuania, the majority of the population practices Christianity Catholicism, and other Christianity Faiths as their religion.

Nature is a blessing from God and we must protect it because it provides us with the oxygen and food to survive. It also helps to keep our environment beautiful and clean. To emphasize the significance of nature, Lithuania has selected a few forces of nature as national symbols. The white stork is both the national bird and the national animal of Lithuania. The national flower is the Rue plant. The national tree of Lithuania is the Stelmužė Oak, and the highest peak is Aukštojas Hill.

Mythical creatures can be found in the literature and mythologies of many different nations. They represent imaginative representations of various creatures, humans, or hybrids. They are known for their specific features, supernatural abilities, and distinctive appearance. The mythical creature of Lithuania is Vampire.

Sports have always played an important role in developing the social and cultural structure of Lithuania and other countries. When it comes to designating a sport as the official symbol, Basketball is considered the country's national sport.
