North Macedonia is a landlocked country in <u>Europe</u>. The official name of North Macedonia is the Republic of North Macedonia. It shares borders with 5 countries: <u>Bulgaria</u>, <u>Greece</u>, <u>Serbia</u>, <u>Kosovo</u>, and <u>Albania</u>. The people of North Macedonia are called Macedonian. The country's average elevation is 741 m (2,431 ft), whereas the country's terrain can be defined as; Mountainous territory covered with deep basins and valleys; three large lakes, each divided by a frontier line; country bisected by the Vardar River. The country's usual climate is warm, with dry summers and autumns; relatively cold winters with heavy snowfall.

The Macedonian denar serves as the national unit of currency, and the National Bank of North Macedonia is recognized as the country's central bank. The domain for North Macedonia is .mk and the country code is +389.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization, art, and architecture. The Museum of Macedonia serves the same purpose and is considered one of the most significant tourist attractions. The Museum of Macedonia is home to a large collection of artifacts. It has been designated as the national museum of the country.
