The Marshall Islands is a country in <u>Australia/Oceania</u>. The official name of the Marshall Islands is the Republic of the Marshall Islands. The people of the Marshall Islands are called Marshallese. The country is in Oceania, two archipelagic island chains of 29 atolls, each made up of many small islets, and five single islands in the North Pacific Ocean, about halfway between Hawaii and Australia.

The literacy rate in the Marshall Islands is 98.3%.

The country's total area is 181.43 km² (70.05 sq mi), and the total population is 59,190. The country's average elevation is 2 m, whereas the country's terrain can be defined as; Low coral limestone and sand islands. The country's usual climate is tropical; hot and humid; the wet season is May to November; islands border the typhoon belt.

The area of land next to a sea is called the coast, and a coastline is defined as the line where land and sea meet. The Marshall Islands has 370.4 km of coastline.

The United States Dollar serves as the national unit of currency. The domain for the Marshall Islands is .mh and the country code is +692.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization, art, and architecture. The Alele Museum & Public Library serves the same purpose and is considered one of the most significant tourist attractions. The Alele Museum & Public Library is home to a large collection of artifacts. It has been designated as the national museum of the country.

The national dress of the Marshall Islands is the lava lavas, and 1 May is designated as National Day.
