The country's total area is 1,972,550 km<sup>2</sup> (761,610 sq mi), and the total population is 128,932,753. The country's average elevation is 1,111 m (3,645 ft), whereas the country's terrain can be defined as; High, rugged mountains; low coastal plains; high plateaus; desert. The country's usual climate varies from tropical to desert.

The area of land next to a sea is called the coast, and a coastline is defined as the line where land and sea meet. Mexico has 9,330 km of coastline.

The Mexican Peso serves as the national unit of currency, and the Bank of Mexico is recognized as the country's central bank. The domain for Mexico is .mx and the country code is +52. Golden eagle is the country's coat of arms.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization, art, and architecture. Museo Nacional de Antropología serves the same purpose and is considered one of the most significant tourist attractions. Museo Nacional de Antropología is home to a large collection of artifacts. It has been designated as the national museum of the country.

The national dress of Mexico is the Huipil, and 16 September is designated as National Day. In Mexico, the majority of the population practices Christianity, Roman Catholicism, and Protestantism as their religion.

To emphasize the significance of nature, Mexico has selected a few forces of nature as national symbols. The Golden eagle is the national bird and the national animal of Mexico.
