Namibia is a country in Africa. The official name of Namibia is the Republic of Namibia. It shares borders with 4 countries: Angola, Zambia, Botswana, and South Africa. The country's usual climate is desert; hot, and dry; rainfall is sparse and erratic.

The area of land next to a sea is called the coast, and a coastline is defined as the line where land and sea meet. Namibia has 1,572 km of coastline.

The Namibian dollar serves as the national unit of currency, and the Bank of Namibia (BoN) is recognized as the country's central bank. The domain for Namibia is .na and the country code is +264. Two Oryx Proper is the country's coat of arms.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization, art, and architecture. The National Museum of Namibia serves the same purpose and is considered one of the most significant tourist attractions. The National Museum of Namibia is home to a large collection of artifacts. It has been designated as the national museum of the country.

The national dress of Namibia is the Ohorokova, and 21 March is designated as National Day. In Namibia, the majority of the population practices Christianity and Lutheranism as their religion.
