
## **NIGERIA**

The country's usual climate varies; equatorial in the south, tropical in the center, and arid in the north.

The area of land next to a sea is called the coast, and a coastline is defined as the line where land and sea meet. Nigeria has 853 km of coastline.

The Nigerian naira serves as the national unit of currency, and the Central Bank of Nigeria is recognized as the country's central bank. The domain for Nigeria is .ng and the country code is +234. Eagle is the country's coat of arms.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization, art, and architecture. The Nigerian National Museum serves the same purpose and is considered

one of the most significant tourist attractions. The Nigerian National Museum is home to a large collection of artifacts. It has been designated as the national museum of the country.

The national dress of Nigeria is the Agbada, and 1 October is designated as National Day. In Nigeria, the majority of the population practices Islam, Christianity, and traditional faiths as their religion.
