Palau is a country in [Australia/Oceania](#). The official name of Palau is the Republic of Palau. The people of Palau are called Palauans. The country is in Oceania, a group of islands in the North Pacific Ocean, southeast of the Philippines.

The country has the time zone UTC+9 (PWT) followed by dd/mm/yyyy as the standard date format.

Palau is divided into 16 states. Koror is Palau's largest city, while Ngerulmud serves as the capital.

The literacy rate in Palau is 96.6%.

The country's total area is 459 km² (177 sq mi), and the total population is 18,094. The country's average elevation is 121 m (397 ft), whereas the country's terrain can be defined as; Varying geologically from the high, mountainous main island of Babelthup to low, coral islands usually fringed by large barrier reefs. The country's usual climate is tropical; hot and humid; the wet season May to November.

The area of land next to a sea is called the coast, and a coastline is defined as the line where land and sea meet. Palau has 1,519 km of coastline.

The United States Dollar serves as the national unit of currency. The domain for Palau is .pw and the country code is +680. "OLBIIL ERA KELULAU" (In Palauan for, "THE HOUSE OF THE WHISPERED DECISIONS") is the country's coat of arms.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization, art, and architecture. The Belau National Museum serves the same purpose and is considered one of the most significant tourist attractions. The Belau National Museum is home to a large collection of artifacts. It has been designated as the national museum of the country.

The national dress of Palau is the Aloha attire, and 9 July is designated as National Day. In Palau, the majority of the population practices Christianity as their religion.

Nature is a blessing from God and we must protect it because it provides us with the oxygen and food to survive. It also helps to keep our environment beautiful and clean. To emphasize the significance of nature, Palau has selected a few forces of nature as national symbols. The Palau fruit dove is both the national bird and animal of Palau. The national flower is Plumeria, and the highest peak is Mount Ngerchelchauus.

They are known for their specific features, supernatural abilities, and distinctive appearance. The mythical creature of Palau is Areop-Enap.

Roman Tmetuchl is the founder of Palau. The country's national anthem was written by Multiple, and composed by Ymesei O. Ezekiel.

The country's national hero is Thomas Esang Remengesau Jr.

Due to their unique qualities and rich cultural or historical backgrounds, national monuments around the world are of great importance. The Palau Nacional is recognized as the national monument of the country. It attracts visitors from all around the world.
