The country's total area is 9,104 km² (3,515 sq mi), and the total population is 2,860,853. The country's average elevation is 4ft, whereas the country's terrain can be defined as; Mostly mountains with a coastal plain belt in the north; mountains precipitous to sea on the west coast; sandy beaches along most coastal areas. The country's usual climate is tropical marine, mild; with little seasonal temperature variation.

The area of land next to a sea is called the coast, and a coastline is defined as the line where land and sea meet. Puerto Rico has 501 km of coastline.

The United States Dollar serves as the national unit of currency. The domain for Puerto Rico is .pr and the country code is +1. Puerto Rican spindalis (bird); coqui (frog) is the country's coat of arms.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization, art, and architecture. The National Museum of Puerto Rican Arts & Culture serves the same purpose and is considered one of the most significant tourist attractions. The National Museum of Puerto Rican Arts & Culture is home to a large collection of artifacts. It has been designated as the national

museum of the country.

The national dress of Puerto Rico is the Guayaberas, and 25 July is designated as National Day. In Puerto Rico, the majority of the population practices Roman Catholicism, and Protestantism as their religion.

To emphasize the significance of nature, Puerto Rico has selected a few forces of nature as national symbols. Poetry is a highly valued form of art, and many poets are considered significant national symbols of the country. The national poet of Puerto Rico is Manuel Fernández Juncos.

Pedro Albizu Campos is the founder of Puerto Rico. The country's national anthem was written by Manuel Fernández Juncos, and composed by Félix Astol Artés.

Mausoleums are buildings dedicated to holding someone's remains. It serves as a reminder of the nation's revolutionary fighters who sacrificed their lives for the country. Mausoleums are one of the most significant historical landmarks. The national mausoleum of Puerto Rico is Puerto Rico National Cemetery. The country's national hero is Pedro Albizu Campos.

Due to their unique qualities and rich cultural or historical backgrounds, national monuments around the world are of great importance. San Juan National Historic Site is recognized as the national monument of the country. It attracts visitors from all around the world.
