The country's total area is 238,397 km² (92,046 sq mi), and the total population is 19,237,691. The country's average elevation is 414 m (1,358 ft), whereas the country's terrain can be defined as; Central Transylvanian Basin is separated from the Moldavian Plateau on the east by the Eastern Carpathian Mountains and separated from the Walachian Plain on the south the Transylvanian Alps. The country's usual climate is temperate; cold, cloudy winters with frequent snow and fog; sunny summers with frequent showers and thunderstorms.

The area of land next to a sea is called the coast, and a coastline is defined as the line where land and sea meet. Romania has 225 km of coastline.

The Romanian leu serves as the national unit of currency, and the National Bank of Romania is recognized as the country's central bank. The domain for Romania is .ro and the country code is +40. Golden eagle is the country's coat of arms.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization, art, and architecture. The National Museum of Art of Romania serves the same purpose and is

considered one of the most significant tourist attractions. The National Museum of Art of Romania is home to a large collection of artifacts. It has been designated as the national museum of the country.

The national dress of Romania is the Căciulă, and 1 December is designated as National Day. In Romania, the majority of the population practices Christianity as their religion.
