
SAINT VINCENT AND THE GRENADINES

Saint Vincent and the Grenadines is a country in <u>North America</u>. The people of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines are called Saint Vincentians. The country is situated in the Caribbean, islands between the Caribbean Sea and the North Atlantic Ocean, north of Trinidad and Tobago.

The literacy rate in Saint Vincent and the Grenadines is 95.6%.

The country's total area is 389 km² (150 sq mi), and the total population is 110,940. The country's terrain is volcanic and mountainous. The country's usual climate is tropical; with little seasonal temperature variation; rainy season (May to November).

The area of land next to a sea is called the coast, and a coastline is defined as the line where land and sea meet. Saint Vincent and the Grenadines have 84 km of coastline.

The Eastern Caribbean dollar serves as the national unit of currency, and the Eastern Caribbean Central Bank is recognized as the country's central bank. The domain for Saint Vincent and the Grenadines is .vc and the country code is +784.

The national dress of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines is the T-shirts or camisoles, sarong, and shorts. 27 October is designated as National Day. In Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, the majority of the population practices Christianity and Rastafarianism as their religion.

Nature is a blessing from God and we must protect it because it provides us with the oxygen and

food to survive. It also helps to keep our environment beautiful and clean. To emphasize the significance of nature, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines have selected a few forces of nature as national symbols. The highest peak is La Soufrière.
