
San Marino

The country's total area is 61.2 km² (23.6 sq mi), and the total population is 33,931. The country's average elevation is 433 m (1,417 ft), whereas the country's terrain can be defined as; Rugged mountains. The country's usual climate is Mediterranean; mild to cool winters; warm, sunny summers.

The Euro serves as the national unit of currency, and the Central Bank of the Republic of San Marino (CBSM) is recognized as the country's central bank. The domain for San Marino is .sm and the country code is +378. Three peaks each displaying a tower are the country's coat of arms.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization, art, and architecture. Museo di Stato serves the same purpose and is considered one of the most significant tourist attractions. Museo di Stato is home to a large collection of artifacts. It has been designated as the national museum of the country.

The national dress of San Marino is the Drindl, and 11 May is designated as National Day. In San Marino, the majority of the population practices Roman Catholicism as their religion.

Nature is a blessing from God and we must protect it because it provides us with the oxygen and food to survive. It also helps to keep our environment beautiful and clean. To emphasize the
