The area of land next to a sea is called the coast, and a coastline is defined as the line where land and sea meet. Singapore has 193 km of coastline.

The Singapore dollar serves as the national unit of currency, and the Monetary Authority of Singapore is recognized as the country's central bank. The domain for Singapore is .sg and the country code is +65. Lion, merlion (mythical half lion-half fish creature), and orchid is the country's coat of arms.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization, art, and architecture. The National Museum of Singapore serves the same purpose and is considered one of the most significant tourist attractions. The National Museum of Singapore is home to a large collection of artifacts. It has been designated as the national museum of the country.

The national dress of Singapore is the Baju kurung, and 9 August is designated as National Day. In Singapore, the majority of the population practices Buddhism, Christianity, Islam, Taoism, and folk religion as their religion.
