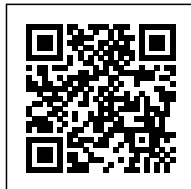
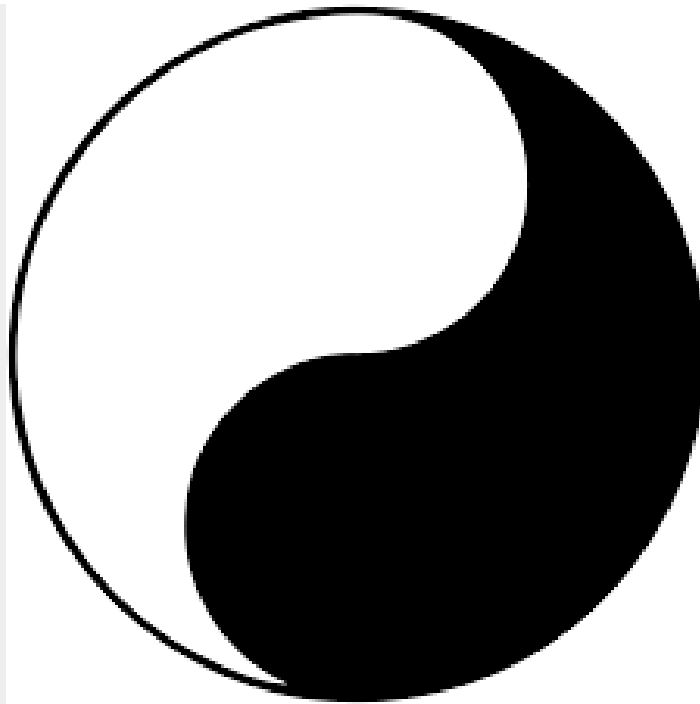


TAOISM

The most well-known symbol of [Taoism](#) is the **yin yang**, also known as the **taijitu**. It is a circular emblem divided into two equal halves, one black and one white, with a curved line separating them.
