Trinidad and Tobago is a country in <u>North America</u>. The official name of Trinidad and Tobago is the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago. The people of Trinidad and Tobago are called Trinidadians. The country is in the Caribbean, islands between the Caribbean Sea and the North Atlantic Ocean, northeast of Venezuela.

The literacy rate in Trinidad and Tobago is 96.6%.

The country's total area is 5,131 km<sup>2</sup> (1,981 sq mi), and the total population is 1,399,488. The country's average elevation is 83 m (272 ft), whereas the country's terrain can be defined as; Mostly plains with some hills and low mountains. The country's usual climate is tropical; rainy season (June to December).

The area of land next to a sea is called the coast, and a coastline is defined as the line where land and sea meet. Trinidad and Tobago has 362 km of coastline.

The Trinidad and Tobago dollar serves as the national unit of currency, and the Central Bank of Trinidad and Tobago is recognized as the country's central bank. The domain for Trinidad and Tobago is .tt and the country code is +868. Scarlet ibis (bird of Trinidad); cocrico (bird of Tobago) is the country's coat of arms.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization,

art, and architecture. The National Museum and Art Gallery of Trinidad and Tobago serve the same purpose and are considered one of the most significant tourist attractions. The National Museum and Art Gallery of Trinidad and Tobago is home to a large collection of artifacts. It has been designated as the national museum of the country.

The national dress of Trinidad and Tobago is the Trinidad, however, has no defined national garment, and 31 August is designated as National Day. In Trinidad and Tobago, the majority of the population practices Christianity, Hinduism, Islam, and Bahá´í as their religion.

Nature is a blessing from God and we must protect it because it provides us with the oxygen and food to survive. It also helps to keep our environment beautiful and clean. To emphasize the significance of nature, Trinidad and Tobago has selected a few forces of nature as national symbols. Scarlet Ibis is the national bird and animal of Trinidad and Tobago. The national flower is Chaconia, whereas the national tree of Trinidad and Tobago is the Chaconia, and the highest peak is Aripo Peak.

Mythical creatures can be found in the literature and mythologies of many different nations. They represent imaginative representations of various creatures, humans, or hybrids. They are known for their specific features, supernatural abilities, and distinctive appearance. The mythical creature of Trinidad and Tobago is Soucouyant.

Sports have always played an important role in developing the social and cultural structure of Trinidad and Tobago and other countries. When it comes to designating a sport as the official symbol, Football is considered the country's national sport.

Eric Williams is the founder of Trinidad and Tobago. The country's national anthem was written by Patrick Castagne, and composed by Patrick Castagne.

The country's national hero is Hasely Joachim Crawford TC.
