

Ukraine is a country in *Europe*. It shares borders with 7 countries:

<u>Belarus</u>, <u>Russia</u>, <u>Moldova</u>, <u>Romania</u>, <u>Hungary</u>, <u>Slovakia</u>, and <u>Poland</u>. The people of Ukraine are called Ukrainian. The country is in Eastern Europe, bordering the Black Sea, between Poland, Romania, and Moldova in the west and Russia in the east.

The literacy rate in Ukraine is 99.8%.

The country's total area is 603,628 km² (233,062 sq mi), and the total population is 43,733,762. The country's average elevation is 175 m (574 ft), whereas the country's terrain can be defined as; Most of Ukraine consists of fertile plains (steppes) and plateaus, mountains being found only in the west (the Carpathians), and in the Crimean Peninsula in the extreme south. The country's usual climate is temperate continental; Mediterranean only on the southern Crimean coast; precipitation is disproportionately distributed, highest in the west and north, lesser in east and southeast; winters vary from cool along the Black Sea to cold farther inland; summers are warm across the greater part of the country, hot in the south.

The area of land next to a sea is called the coast, and a coastline is defined as the line where land and sea meet. Ukraine has 2,782 km of coastline.

The Ukrainian hryvnia serves as the national unit of currency, and the National Bank of Ukraine is recognized as the country's central bank. The domain for Ukraine is .ua and the country code is +380. Trident (tryzub) is the country's coat of arms.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization,

art, and architecture. The National Museum of the History of Ukraine serves the same purpose and is considered one of the most significant tourist attractions. The National Museum of the History of Ukraine is home to a large collection of artifacts. It has been designated as the national museum of the country.

The national dress of Ukraine is the Vyshyvanka, and 24 August is designated as National Day. In Ukraine, the majority of the population practices Christianity as their religion.

Nature is a blessing from God and we must protect it because it provides us with the oxygen and food to survive. It also helps to keep our environment beautiful and clean. To emphasize the significance of nature, Ukraine has selected a few forces of nature as national symbols. Common nightingale is both the national bird and animal of Ukraine. The national flower is Sunflower, whereas Cherry is the country's national fruit. The national tree of Ukraine is the Viburnum, Willow, and the highest peak is Hoverla (Gora Goverla).

Mythical creatures can be found in the literature and mythologies of many different nations. They represent imaginative representations of various creatures, humans, or hybrids. They are known for their specific features, supernatural abilities, and distinctive appearance. The mythical creature of Ukraine is Baba Yaga.

Sports have always played an important role in developing the social and cultural structure of Ukraine and other countries. When it comes to designating a sport as the official symbol, Football is considered the country's national sport.

Poetry is a highly valued form of art, and many poets are considered significant national symbols of the country. The national poets of Ukraine are Taras Shevchenko, Ivan Franko, and Lesya Ukrainka.

Mykhailo Hrushevsky is the founder of Ukraine. The country's national anthem was written by Pavlo Chubynsky, and composed by Mykhaylo Verbytsky.
