Vanuatu is a country in <u>Australia/Oceania</u>. The official name of Vanuatu is the Republic of Vanuatu. It shares borders with 2 countries: <u>Australia</u>, and <u>Fiji</u>. The people of Vanuatu are called Ni-Vanuatus. The country is in Oceania, a group of islands in the South Pacific Ocean, about three-quarters of the way from Hawaii to Australia.

The country's total area is 12,189 km² (4,706 sq mi), and the total population is 307,145. The country's average elevation is 398 m (1,306 ft), whereas the country's terrain can be defined as; Mostly mountainous islands of volcanic origin; narrow coastal plains. The country's usual climate is tropical; moderated by southeast trade winds from May to October; moderate rainfall from November to April; may be affected by cyclones from December to April.

The area of land next to a sea is called the coast, and a coastline is defined as the line where land and sea meet. Vanuatu has 2,528 km of coastline.

The Vanuatu vatu serves as the national unit of currency, and the Reserve Bank of Vanuatu is recognized as the country's central bank. The domain for Vanuatu is .vu and the country code is +678. Boar's Tusk is the country's coat of arms.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization, art, and architecture. The National Museum of Vanuatu serves the same purpose and is considered

one of the most significant tourist attractions. The National Museum of Vanuatu is home to a large collection of artifacts. It has been designated as the national museum of the country.

The national dress of Vanuatu is the Nambas, and 30 July is designated as National Day. In Vanuatu, the majority of the population practices Christianity as their religion.

Nature is a blessing from God and we must protect it because it provides us with the oxygen and food to survive. It also helps to keep our environment beautiful and clean. To emphasize the significance of nature, Vanuatu has selected a few forces of nature as national symbols. Vanuatu's national bird is the Vanuatu megapode, while its national animal is the Iguana. The national flower is Hibiscus, whereas Jackfruit is the country's national fruit. The national tree of Vanuatu is the Coconut palm, and the highest peak is Tabwémasana.
