The country's usual climate is tropical; modified by altitude; rainy season (October to April).

The Zambian kwacha serves as the national unit of currency, and the Bank of Zambia (BoZ) is recognized as the country's central bank. The domain for Zambia is .zm and the country code is +260. African Fish Eagle is the country's coat of arms.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization, art, and architecture. Lusaka National Museum serves the same purpose and is considered one of the most significant tourist attractions. Lusaka National Museum is home to a large collection of artifacts. It has been designated as the national museum of the country.

The national dress of Zambia is the Chitenge, and 24 October is designated as National Day. In

Zambia, the majority of the population practices Christianity as their religion.

To emphasize the significance of nature, Zambia has selected a few forces of nature as national symbols. African fish eagle is both the national bird and animal of Zambia.
