Zimbabwe is a landlocked country in <u>Africa</u>. The official name of Zimbabwe is the Republic of Zimbabwe. The country's usual climate is tropical; moderated by altitude; rainy season (November to March).

The United States Dollar, Real Time Gross Settlement dollar serves as the national unit of currency, and the Reserve Bank of Zimbabwe is recognized as the country's central bank. The domain for Zimbabwe is .zw and the country code is +263. Zimbabwe's bird symbol, the African fish eagle, flame lily is the country's coat of arms.

Museums are known to educate and connect visitors with the nation's history, culture, civilization, art, and architecture. The National Museums and Monuments of Zimbabwe (NMMZ) serves the same purpose and is considered one of the most significant tourist attractions. The National Museums and Monuments of Zimbabwe (NMMZ) is home to a large collection of artifacts. It has been designated as the national museum of the country.

The national dress of Zimbabwe is the Ndebele, and 18 April is designated as National Day. In Zimbabwe, the majority of the population practices Christianity as their religion.
